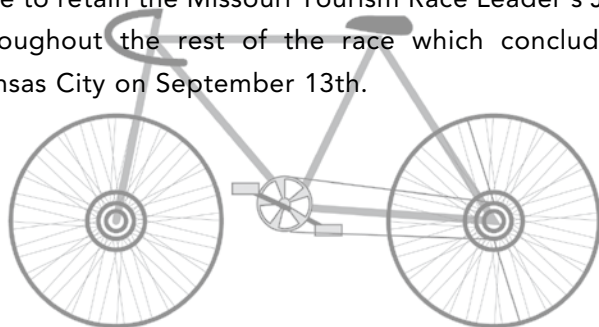
Sedalia Showcase

AmerenUE O&M Project Overview

ProEnergy/AmerenUE CTG project sites – Audrain, Kinmundy, Raccoon Creek, Goose Creek and Pinckneyville Power Plants. Seventeen employees, 28 units consisting of 18 GE frame 7EA's, 4 GE frame 6B's, 4 GE Aero LM6000's, and 2 Siemens frame 501D5A's for a total megawatt output of 2050.



Greetings from the AmerenUE CTG sites! We continue to have a busy year in spite of lower ambient temperatures, decreasing energy demand, and decreasing market prices. To date this year we have been dispatched 625 times with a success rate over 98%. All 28 units have maintained a better than 98% availability as well.



We were awarded an extension to our O&M contract

which is a direct reflection of our commitment to customer satisfaction. If the customer isn't happy, no one is happy!

Safety remains our number one priority. We have not suffered any injuries or lost work days in over 3.5 years. In a combined effort with ProEnergy and AmerenUE management a safety effort for 2009 was/is to practice/conduct emergency response drills at each site. To date we have conducted 14 emergency drills. These include oil spills, man down, electrical fires, major gas leaks, glycol spills, and evacuation. As the sites do these drills more and more the better they react to these emergency situations which also builds their self confidence.

O&M safety project for 2009 was to develop electrical isolation sheets/procedures for every building, package, unit, shed, and in some cases individual pieces of equipment at all five sites. This took a lot of time and effort to research and write but in the end we are confident that if we have a fire on-site we can

electrically isolate. This will not only minimize damage but it will allow the fire dept to fight a fire safely.

We requested AmerenUE install tornado / heavy weather shelters at our CTG sites. The request was not only approved but they also installed tornado shelters at their other CTG sites.

One of the bigger engineering projects for the year was the implementation of VRPC (Voltage Reactive Power Control) which allows Ameren to automatically control VARS/voltage from St. Louis. This required pulling numerous cables, installing transducers, control system logic/graphics development, and extensive online unit testing at all five sites.

We have had eight IL/MO EPA site visits this year to conduct air permit, discharge permit, and waste permit compliance inspections. They inspect the sites, view records, and discuss site compliance practices. All eight inspections by three different IL/MO EPA departments were satisfactory with no discrepancies noted.



We welcomed two new employees this past year. Mike Knutelski at Audrain and Joe Reeser at Goose Creek. Both have worked hard on their plant technician qualifications and they have proven to be valuable assets to our team.



That's the highlights for the year, with a strong slant on safety! Thanks for everyone's support from Sedalia, we appreciate it! See you soon!
