## Project Feature - Termozulia



ProEnergy EPC Services has recently completed the Termozulia project in Maracaibo, Venezuela as scheduled. The power plant, located in the country's second largest city, is a 170 mega watt gas and diesel fired facility.

ProEnergy EPC Services was chosen for the engineering, procurement and construction of the power plant by Enelven, one of the ten state-owned power companies merged under Corpolec, the Venezuelan government entity in charge of electricity. Termozulia will supply Enelven's 400,000 customers with 25% of their power needs. The project began on October 4, 2009.

"This has been a tremendously successful project for many reasons," said ProEnergy President Jeff Canon. "We were able to meet an aggressive schedule, came in right on budget and helped meet the need for power in Venezuela."

## ProEnergy Partners with National Center for Aviation Training

Sedgwick County Technical Education and Training Authority is developing a \$50 million, 230,000 square-foot, National Center for Aviation Training. NCAT will be a world-class aviation and advanced general manufacturing training center on the grounds of Jabara Airport in northeast Wichita. Wichita Area Technical College will serve as managing partner and coordinate course offerings. ProEnergy installed all of the electrical, fire alarm, voice/data cabling, security and audio visual on the project. While some of the campus is still under construction, the Aviation Maintenance Technician program is currently operating with 240 students in the 18 month program. It is the fourth largest school of its kind in the United States.

# Missouri Governor Jay Nixon Visits ProEnergy

ProEnergy was proud to host Missouri Governor Jay Nixon on two different occasions in the last month. On August 18, the Governor visited with ProEnergy leaders and toured the entire Sedalia campus. Then, on September 15, ProEnergy hosted a press conference for the Governor, along with Bluebird and Sho-Me Technologies. Sho-Me Technologies, out of Cass County, will be building a middle-mile network to expand broadband in 30 counties, including Pettis County. The projects from Sho-Me Technologies, along with the Missouri Department of Higher Education will result in an investment of more than \$71 million in the state, creating hundreds of jobs in addition to the expanded broadband availability. The funding awarded to all the MoBroadbandNow initiative projects will generate an investment of more than \$226.5 million in Missouri for job expansion, education, commerce, health care and public safety.
